2020 was a hard year for everyone and Colobus Conservation could not thank you enough for the unending support you have provided us. Through your help in 2020, we have been able to:

- ✓ Plant a total of 254 trees in schools, residential homes and hotels
- ✓ Attend to 210 welfare callouts
- ✓ Attend to 20 human-primate issues
- ✓ Successfully hold 2 major fundraising events
- ✓ Host 326 pupils (7 primary schools) in our education program

Our last season's baby; baby Jiwe, is all grown up! She has blossomed into a beautiful young juvenile and has been integrated into the nursery. She now enjoys the full-time attention of her mom Mrembo and her brother Tiny Tim. However orphan care season is not over, we have a new baby on board. At only 3 weeks old, our baby Ndege (meaning airplane as she was found on the way to the airstrip) lost her mum to a dog attack that would have claimed her life too. Luckily, she was rescued and brought to Colobus Conservation where she is currently under orphan care.

Release



In October 2019, Colobus Conservation conducted 2 major releases, releasing all the captive primates back into the wild. More than one year later, we are elated to report that the released monkeys have finished one year back into the wild with the adult female Sykes already become a mom!
